

A poetic portrait of Peckham's colourful community. An audio and visual journey through the place.


Synopsis

A portrait of Peckham's colourful community through the eyes and ears of a young male walking down Rye Lane, an audio and visual journey through the place. The spoken word touches on the importance of togetherness, while the heavily photographic visuals capture the beauty of the place and people found on the vibrant street. The film captures the surroundings and interactions of the man, whose journey is influentially documented through diegetic and non-diegetic sound. The visuals bounce between documentary observation and fictional reconstruction which creates a dynamic and honest representation of the area.

First time director Isla Gaffney's work is rooted in visual filmmaking, real situations, and influenced by her own experiences. The Back of Our Hands continuously evolved and took on its own personality, defined by observation and improvisation to capture the colourful community of Peckham in all its beauty.
